- self advocacy;
- behavior skills;
- motor skills;
- and skill development for vocational or educa activities;



PROGRAM SPOTLIGHT: ADULT CARE MANAGEMENT

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Adult Care Management assists individuals in thei recovery journey, utilizing person centered practice best practice health promotion services. Our Care Managers oversee and coordinate access to needed ensuring that all needs are addressed in a comprehe manner.

CARING RELATIONSHIPS THAT HELP HEAL

Jesse started his care management services on an Astronomy Outpatient Treatment (AOT) Order in July 2022. Care Manager was required to meet with him 4 tin month for a year. During that time he focused on I mental health. The Care Manager assisted him wit to appointments both mental and physical and also Jesse become independent.

Jesse initially resided at Transitional Living Resider Greater Binghamton Health Center, but he is now by himself with housing supports through Catholi Charities.

Being mentally healthy, he was able to complete his Order in a year, make friends for the first time, and free computer classes online. His relationship with family members grew stronger. He feels he has his support and even visits them regularly. He recently returned from Columbia, South America where he weeks going to classes and making friends with pec over the world.



Jesse's father made a point to personally thank the Manager. He's grateful that due to her and the care management services, his son is mentally healthy for Programs tin What You Can Do Agency News & Pul

CREATING A SAFE SPACE

The Stepping Stone Drop-In Center acts as a safe, demand environment for people with self-reported illness. The program appeals to individuals who have been comfortable participating in other mental heaprograms with requirements for attendance and participation.

The Drop-In Center provides opportunities for so interaction with peers and support from Peer Spec including self-help groups, one-on-one support, ar community projects and outings.

The trained and certified Peer Specialists have lived health experience and are key to making people fee comfortable. One of our Peer Specialists, Seane Be explains "As peers, we don't tell people what to do. don't give them advice, but we can tell them what in a certain situation that might mirror their own situation." Knowing they have been through some similar helps people to open up. However, there's people to do so – anyone is free to come in an TV or have a bite to eat. It's all about giving people to go.



WHAT DOES A TYPICAL DAY LOOK LIKE?



RELOCATING AND EXPANDING

Other planned happenings in 2024 will include the relocation of two of our Individualized Residentia Alternative homes to the former Intermediate Car-(ICF), Our Lady of Hope, which closed in Decem 2023 due to a staffing shortage. This will allow for individuals to move to a barrier free, more spacious The Assertive Community Treatment Team is also applying to expand from a 68 slot team to 100 in o build in a step down level of care.

NEW OPPORTUNITIES

The agency has a bright future which will include participation in the new 1115 waiver that will prov funding for current and new services for Medicaid recipients, exploration of how new technology suc Artificial Intelligence (AI) can help enhance service continued pursuit of new ways to support staff and thousands of people who turn to Catholic Charitiyear in their time of need.
